



2025 AMS Co-ordinator Report

After being appointed in the winter of 2024, we began the year with 65 active Accredited Marshals, of which 34 were trainees. Throughout the season, our marshals supported nine open road races, with a total of 93 accredited marshals taking part. In addition, due to shortages in neighbouring areas, Yorkshire volunteers stepped up to support four events in the East Midlands, ensuring those races could go ahead safely.

Within our team of 26 active Accredited Marshal Scheme (AMS) members, six also take on multiple roles across the sport – including commissaires, NEG, and event organisers – demonstrating the depth of commitment from our volunteers. In 2025, we successfully trained two new marshals, one of whom has already qualified.

Unfortunately, we did lose two marshals for personal reasons, and there remains a group of 39 who, although registered, did not attend an event this season. This highlights the ongoing challenge of keeping people engaged and active within the programme.

Looking ahead to next year, our focus will be on recruiting and training more marshals, while also encouraging those already accredited to become more actively involved. By doing so, we can continue to provide vital support to events across the region and beyond, ensuring the safety and success of road racing for all.
